- **Bath Old Jewish Burial Grounds**, 174 Bradford Road, Coombe Hill, Bath BA2

This small Jewish cemetery with the earliest burial in 1812 (Sarah Moses November 1812). The last burial was in 1921. There were about 50 burials. Since 1915, it has been one of the disused cemeteries administered by the Board of Deputies of British Jews.
